Use the front brake to hold the bike in place - this is usually sufficient unless it's a really steep hill, in which case you'll take your foot off the ground to operate the rear brake. Twist the throttle and gradually release the clutch lever. You'll feel it start to bite. Balance the throttle and release the brake.
